Internationally acclaimed architect Richard Murphy will deliver a presentation titled “The Work of Richard Murphy Architects” on the 5th April 2006 at Castille Wine Vaults, Valletta. The presentation will start at 1800hrs.

Richard Murphy was educated at Newcastle and Edinburgh Universities and for four years taught at Edinburgh University and researched the work of the Venetian Architect, Carlo Scarpa, at the Castelvecchio, Verona. He has since written the definitive book on the building and went on to write a second book on Scarpa’s Palazzo Quenni Stampalia in Venice and presented a film for Channel 4 on Scarpa. He also co-wrote “An Architect’s Appreciation of Charles Rennie Mackintosh”.

In October 1991 Richard founded the Practice of Richard Murphy Architects which has since won fourteen awards, more than any other Scottish Practice. His work has ranged from domestic through to public and private housing, buildings for the arts and education including a new school in Malta, renovation of the British Embassy in Macedonia and a new High Commission Building in Colombo Sri Lanka, both the latter being commissioned by the Foreign & Commonwealth Office. His work has been extensively reviewed and he himself frequently contributes to architectural journals. He has lectured widely both on Scarpa and on his own work both at home and abroad.
